HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Carers

It has been a short week for our students, yet a very busy one for the school. Last night we opened our doors to the parents of the next September intake to look around the school, see the work that the students have been doing in each faculty and get a feel for the ethos of the school. We had approximately 800 visitors meet our staff and students during the 2.5 hour period, around 350 families interested in one of our 180 spaces for their daughters. I would like to thank my staff for their preparatory work and organisation for Open Evening and also for welcoming these visitors and answering any questions they had. Sincere thanks also to the students who assisted so well to make the event a success, either as tour guides, helpers within faculties, performers or who helped in any other way. It is clear that they are all very proud of what is offered at WSFG. The school, in turn, is very proud of our students and their achievements.

My particular thanks go to the students that assisted me with the Headteacher's address to a full capacity Hewett Hall. *Ruby (8H)* and *Olivia (9C)* played their flutes beautifully: *Ruby* playing Mozart's Flute Concerto No.1 in G and *Olivia* Bach's Ave Maria and *Ubah (11W)*, *Hasiba, Edith (7F)* and *Ella (11G)* who spoke so eloquently to our audiences. Hasiba and Edith have been in the school only a

matter of weeks and were supported, ably, by the two Year 11 students. The speeches were the girls' own words and were truly inspirational, so much so that I have printed Ella's speech, which took the form of verse, in this edition of the Greensheet. Once you have read this, you will need to remind yourself that these are all her own words and understand why they brought a tear to my eye. See page 4.

During my speech I spoke at length about the progress students make while they are at WSFG, having received confirmation yesterday that Government comparators rank progress here as "Well above average". Indeed our progress puts us in the top 1-2% nationally. This progress is why the Mayor of London invited us to join his Schools for Success programme, along with just 24 other secondary schools across the Capital and one of the reasons we have recently been appointed as a Teaching School/National Support School.

Aside from Open Evening, on Tuesday some of our Year 11 students had the unforgettable experience of performing to an audience of thousands at The Royal Albert Hall as part of the Steel Pans Band at the Primary Prom. My thanks to *Richard Murphy*, who has guided the students to this success and to Ms Bradshaw our Head of Music who also accompanied the students.

Also on Tuesday Year 9 students with an interest in another field of performing arts attended a workshop run by the Shakespeare Schools Festival company.

In school, at lunchtimes on Monday and Tuesday, Year 11 students were able to attend an information sharing session from two of our local sixth form colleges: Sir George Monoux College on Monday and London Academy of Excellence on Tuesday. Walthamstow Academy will be in school on Monday lunchtime (16th October) and other sixth form colleges will be visiting later in the year.

A reminder to the parents/carers of students in Year 7 that next Wednesday, 18th October, Year 7 students only will be dismissed from school at 12.25pm for their Settling-in Afternoon. You should have been given an appointment time to meet with your daughter's tutor and will return with your daughter for the appointment only (please see p3 for further details). Students in Years 8-11 will be in school as usual on Wednesday. We are looking forward to receiving more visitors to the school and the opportunity to show them why we believe WSFG is exceptional.
