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#### **HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE**

Dear Parents and Carers

What a delight it was to return to school on Monday to see the front gardens a mass of purple and yellow crocuses, planted by students years gone by. Snowdrops are also out in their glory in the small woodland at the back of the school from before the holiday.

The behaviour of all the girls this week in winter interform-yes they have been competing outside- has been superb and extremely good humoured. Thank you also to the sports staff for organising the whole event. The girls left school with many a rosy cheek!



On Monday, almost a hundred students and staff left for the GCSE Geography residential field trip to Norfolk. They braved the elements on Cromer beach but were warmed up by their trip to Norwich. Once more, we were complimented for the excellent behaviour of our students. This was the photograph Mr Gunzi sent the staff to demonstrate that they did actually leave the centre.

Thank you to Ms Fearnley and all staff for giving up their time for this trip.

Tuesday marked 100 years since 8.4 million people became the first British women to be granted the vote. The 1918 Representation of the People Act was the culmination of a bitter, heroic, and frequently violent campaign for equality. We will be reflecting on this achievement in assemblies, but also in other ways. On Thursday evening I will be joined the Council Leader Clare Coghill and other Waltham Forest women in a commemorative photograph at the Town Hall. Ms Kelly, our Librarian also came along, wearing her wonderful suffragette outfit. The reason we introduced the colour purple into our school logo was to acknowledge the fight of women the world over to have equal status with men. A hundred years does not seem such a long time ago and there is still more to be done!

#### ELECTION OF PARENT GOVERNOR - February 2018

As you know I have been requesting nominations from parents who wish to serve on the Governing Body. This request has been repeated in consecutive editions of the Greensheet which you will have received by email and the information has been displayed on our website.

By the closing date on Friday 26th January I had received four nominations and as there is only one vacancy for a Parent Governor on the Governing Body it will be necessary to hold an election.

Each parent is entitled to one ballot paper, which should be returned to the school on or before Wednesday 28th February, 2018. On the ballot paper you will be able to vote for one candidate. Papers with more than the permitted number of votes will be disallowed. Ballot papers may be returned via your child, or if you wish may be placed directly in the ballot box in the school office.

The voting paper should be sealed in an unmarked envelope which should then be sealed in an outer envelope marked "Parent Governor Elections" with your name on the outer envelope. Once the name has been checked against the list of those eligible to vote, the outer envelope will be discarded and the inner envelope placed in the ballot box.

The following are copies of the statements written by the candidates saving why they wish to become parent governors; these may help you to cast your vote.

The votes will be counted on Thursday 1st March, 2018 and the outcome will be advised in the following edition of the Greensheet.

This week the girls worked collaboratively to make an origami dodecahedron, using instructions from a Maths Craft Group in New Zealand:




