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#### HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Carers

I hope that our new parents and students are finding the weekly information in the Greensheet informative and useful. As it is the main channel of communication with parents and carers as well as the wider school community, it is important to keep an eye on the messages it contains and we hope that you will be interested to read about the events and activities that our students are involved in as we progress through the year.

We are very pleased to have been invited by Sadig Khan, the Mayor of London, to join his Schools for Success programme. Approximately 6% of London primary and secondary schools, from all of the 32 boroughs, were invited to be part of the programme, based on their performance tables and the significant progress made by their low prior attainment cohort. WSFG is one of only 25 secondary schools in this network, designed to share excellent teaching and leadership practice. By improving the outcomes of pupils who begin



with attainment levels behind their peers, schools such as WSFG are making a significant contribution to reducing educational inequalities and promoting social mobility for young Londoners. WSFG will be formally recognised for having done "exceptionally well with low prior attaining pupils" at the programme launch at City Hall on Friday morning. Together with our Chair of Governors, Ms Gillian Barker, I am looking forward to representing WSFG at the celebration and award ceremony.

Our talented students have this week been auditioning for the Glee Club. The music room was full of over 100 hopeful students on Tuesday evening after school, Ms Bradshaw tells me that call backs for the successful girls will be taking place next week. I look forward to being in the audience for a performance soon.

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On Wednesday afternoon there was another performing arts activity, when a group of students took part in a workshop run by the Old Vic. Our students are certainly heeding the school motto, proudly displayed at the back of the Hewett Hall 'Neglect not the gift that is in thee' on so many levels.

We were recently contacted by Waltham Forest Council on behalf of Councillor Clyde Loakes, Deputy Leader of the Council, with a request to install a Waltham Forest heritage plaque in recognition of John Kemp Starley, inventor of the modern bicycle on the wall outside the school. John Kemp Starley was born on Church Hill, Walthamstow and there is an exhibition about his life and influence at Vestry House Museum which runs until next February 2018.

The official unveiling of the plaque took place at noon on Thursday and was attended by ClIr Grace Williams, Portfolio Lead for Children and Young People and Rosalind Zalicks from the Highways Department at LBWF. Look out for the plaque next time you walk towards St Mary's church from the school.

# Year 9 & 10 Science GCSE Revision Guides.


The Science Department will be selling AQA GCSE Science Revision Guides to Years 9 & 10 from Student Services at a much reduced price.
