SPECIAL EDITION: GCSE Results 2017

On results day this year, we were joined by the Leader of Waltham Forest Council, Cllr. Clare Coghill and former Mayor (and also ex WSFG student) Cllr. Saima Mahmud. Cllr. Coghill is the first female council leader of Waltham Forest so she was an excellent role model for the girls as they waited anxiously for their examination results.

On the first day of term, we celebrated the fantastic GCSE achievements of our Year 11 students with staff and the whole school. These were the first students nationally to sit the tougher-and longer- English and Mathematics GCSEs, which were graded by the new extended range of 1-9, with 9 being even higher than the A* grade. 30% of entries from all subjects at WSFG were awarded an A* or A (7-9) grade. Below are the results of some of our highest attainers, but many more made excellent progress overall. I want to also pay tribute to our hard working staff who managed to guide our students through the curriculum changes this year and ensure that these Year 11s achieved the success they deserved.

As you can see here, large numbers achieved the very highest grades at GCSE level and they have all made us and their families very proud. Below is just a sample of some of them who have now secured places at excellent sixth form and college provision.

Dear Parents and Carers

As you are aware, the school changed the uniform requirement regarding the colour of outdoor coats last term from plain dark to black, to take effect from the start of this autumn term.

This was communicated to you via our weekly Greensheets from the beginning of June and your daughter was told about this change in assemblies. It was also made clear on the uniform section of our website, where parents are asked to ensure when purchasing new items of uniform, that they are of the permitted styles. The majority of students have returned to school with black coats or jackets and look very smart indeed.

It has been brought to my attention that a number of parents and carers had not seen this message in the Greensheet, nor had they been given the information by their daughters, and they have purchased new non-black coats during the holidays.

I have heeded your communication with the school and fully appreciate your concern on this matter.

As a result we have delayed the introduction of these changes, with the exception of Year 7 students.

Please note the revised uniform requirement regarding coats:

Year 7	Plain black outer coat	(compulsory)
Year 8	Plain black outer coat	(compulsory from January 2018)
Year 9	Plain black outer coat	(compulsory from January 2018)
Year 10	Plain dark outer coat	(as previously required)
Year 11	Plain dark outer coat	(as previously required).

If any parent or carer experiences financial hardship as a result of these changes, please contact your daughter's SPL directly.

- If a student is wearing a non-uniform item, it will be confiscated and she will
 be asked to change into an item of correct uniform provided by the school.
 The student will collect any confiscated uniform items at the end of the day
 from her SPL. The conduct card will be signed.
- If a student is wearing a skirt that is too short, she will be asked to adjust it but if it is still too short, she will be asked to change into an item of correct and appropriate uniform provided by the school. The conduct card will be signed.
- Any items of non-uniform jewellery will be confiscated and Parents / Carers will be sent a letter asking them to collect the item just before the next half term holiday. This will NOT be returned at the end of the day. The conduct card will be signed.
- If the lanyard or conduct card are not worn, there will be an automatic one hour detention that Parents / Carers will be informed of by letter.
 The conduct card will be signed.
- Please see page 9 of the Student Planner for uniform and jewellery regulations at WSFG.
- NO trainers / canvas sport shoes of ANY type allowed.
- Hoodies / denim / leather and leather look jackets are NOT allowed on school premises.
- NO acrylic / false nails allowed.
- Blazers are COMPULSORY for Year 7 and 8 and MUST be worn at all times during the school day unless permission is given by a member of staff to remove it.
 - Sanctions will apply if the blazer is not worn by Year 7 and 8 students.

School Uniform Update September 2017/8 (First issued June 2017)

Dear Parents / Carers and Students,

We are very proud of our school uniform at WSFG and we wish to ensure that all students and their families are clear about the high expectations that we have in terms of the standard of dress that is expected for school. The WSFG uniform is very versatile and students have a number of choices of uniform items.

Please ensure that if you are purchasing new items of uniform that they are of the permitted styles. The recommended suppliers stock the correct accepted items of uniform. Any items that are not listed below are not acceptable for school and you will be asked to change the item for one that is within the uniform rules.

Please note carefully the guidelines on shoes and outdoor coats which have been clarified for September 2017. Also please note that your daughter will not be allowed to wear noticeable make-up that is not minimal or discreet. False nails or false eyelashes are also not allowed for school.

If you have any queries or questions about uniform for September 2017, please contact your daughter's Progress Leader.

The compulsory uniform consists of:

Dark, bottle green pleated knee length skirt or trousers in the acceptable school styles below:

• Dark, bottle green religious dress in plain, cotton fabric.

- Strictly no jeans style trousers, tight trousers or leggings are permitted.
- Plain white blouse with shirt collar to be worn by all. Shirts can be long sleeved or short sleeved.
- Plain white vest top can be worn under the school shirt if necessary.
- Dark, bottle green sweater, cardigan or sweatshirt without any logo. No other colours of sweater or cardigan are permitted.
- Plain black, white or bottle green knee socks, ankle socks or tights are to be worn at all times. Over the knee socks are not permitted.
- Plain black low-heeled sensible shoes or boots. Trainers and higher heels are not permitted. Footwear must have black laces and not have pattern, colour or large branded logos.
- PLAIN, BLACK COAT OR JACKET that is suitably waterproof. (See letter on page 6 for clarification.)
 Denim, leather, faux leather jackets and hoodies are not permitted to be
 - worn to or from school, or in school.
- Hijabs must be plain white or dark bottle green with no fringe and must be worn pinned securely.
- School blazer with WSFG logo (see above) is compulsory for Years 7 and 8.
 This must be worn at all times. The blazer is optional for Years 9 -11.

Uniform Extras:

- Facial coverings are not permitted to be worn in school and if worn to or from school, must be removed once the student enters the school gate.
- Make-up, if worn, must be minimal and discreet. False eyelashes, eyelash
 extensions, acrylic or other types of nail extensions are not permitted.
- Students are permitted to wear one small stud in each ear (which should be
 no bigger than the size of a pea) and a wrist watch only. Facial piercings and
 visible body piercings (including tongue piercings) are not permitted. Any
 other jewellery items will be confiscated and will only be returned to
 parents / carers.
- Hair must be of a natural colour and hair of a non-natural colour is not permitted. All hair accessories must be small, discreet and plain.
- Coloured or patterned contact lenses are not permitted.
- The school reserves the right to ask a student who is not in correct uniform to remove non-uniform items or change into uniform items provided by the school for the day.
- The school does not accept any responsibility for the loss or damage of any confiscated items.

Olive Dining Menus for the Autumn Term


All menus are subject to change. This week we are on Menu Week One.
