## Music Department Year 7 Topic: Keyboard Skills Learning Journey

## Prior learning:

*Musical Literacy* – Students have learnt how to read basic rhythmic notation in the Rhythm topic. They have not yet looked at reading pitch so they will do that in this unit.

*Performance Skills* – *Students have performed as part of an ensemble in the rhythm and voices topic. This topic they will focus on performing as a soloist.* 

*Listening/Analysis* – Students will listen to examples of film music and will use musical terms to describe melodic movement and instrumentation. They have done this in previous topics.

## Where will we use these ideas again:
