HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Carers

We started this week with the terrible news of another terrorist attack on people going about their lives in London; this time on worshippers leaving Finsbury Park Mosque, during Ramadan, in an area just over five miles away from Walthamstow. Our thoughts and prayers are with all those affected by this atrocity, particularly the fellow worshippers and families and friends of those involved. These attacks are designed to break up our very strong community cohesion. In fact, the effect is the very opposite. In the words of Jo Cox MP, who was murdered a year ago this month;

'We have more in common than that which divides us'

At school we have been focussing on community spirit and how at the most difficult of times we can all come together to support and make a positive difference, for example after the terrible tragedy of the Grenfell Tower fire. Mr Morrow's powerful assembly to the whole school about the fire and the questions being asked subsequently has prompted many girls to volunteer to raise money to help the survivors. We observed the national one minute's silence on Monday morning at 11.00am and we will be holding a whole school fire drill on Friday, as we do regularly throughout the school year. The School Council is meeting to explore fundraising through different events; you will be kept up to date with this.

On Friday evening there was a touching memorial for a former pupil who sadly passed away last year. After an intimate tribute to her in the Hewett Hall, attended by her school friends, close family friends and members of staff, we went into the grounds where a bench has been installed to commemorate her life. Her friends can sit on the bench, enjoy the lovely surroundings and remember her.

It has been a pleasure this week to meet the students who will be joining Year 7 in September and their parents and carers. We look forward to seeing them again next week on the evening of Thursday 29th June and again during the school day on Wednesday 5th July.

It has been a busy week on the sporting front, with several activities taking place. On Monday a group of Student Leaders from Years 8 and 9 ran a Tri-golf event at the Waltham Forest Feelgood Centre while Ms Famiglietti took another group of KS3 students to the Olympic Park to see an international hockey match. Teams from Years 9 and 10 represented us in the borough rounders rally on Wednesday morning. I am pleased to announce that Year 10 came 3rd and Year 9 came 2nd in the borough. On Thursday, students in Year 10 had their summer interform.

On Thursday evening, it is the Art, Design and Technology Exhibition which is open to you all from 4.30-6pm. You are welcome to come and see the excellent standard of creative work produced by the girls.

The GCSE examinations are now coming to a close and so the Year 11 students will be back in school on Friday for our annual Leavers' Day celebrations; they will enjoy an afternoon of reminiscences, fun and relaxation after all their hard work-as well as the traditional strawberries and ice cream! Examinations will continue in school, however, as the Year 10 students have begun their Mock GCSEs.

As we approach the end of Ramadan we would like to wish all members of our Muslim community Eid-al-Fitr Mubarak. Please note the message from Ms King, the school Attendance Manager in this Greensheet.

Dear Parents / Carers,

The school requests that Parents / Carers inform Ms. King, the School Attendance Manager in advance of the day that your daughter will be absent for her religious observance.

Please put this information in writing. If you have not informed the school in advance as requested, you will receive an absence enquiry text as is school procedure.

According to the DFE and Borough guidelines, students are allowed three days' religious observance in an academic year. If your daughter's religious observance days exceed three in one academic year, the extra days will be marked as an unauthorised absence.

Dear Parents/Carers

Could you please ensure that if your daughter is fasting, she does so according to the sunnah method. That is she should have a full and nutritious breakfast (SEHRI) before keeping the fast.

Your daughter should not keep fast if she is feeling unwell. In addition, in the rare event of feeling very ill during a fast, she should break the fast rather than allowing her condition to get worse.

As agreed by medics, fasting is not at all detrimental to our health and in fact it can be physically very beneficial. However, the correct method of fasting should be adhered to.

Focus of the Fortnight 19th-30th June 2017 Punctuality to School

Dear Parents / Carers.

The Focus of the Fortnight is on punctuality to school. The school values good habits and being on time is an excellent habit to form. The school is open to students from 8am and a breakfast is available for early arrivals.

It is very clear (see page 3 of the Student Planner) that students need to be at their desks, ready for registration, by 8.45am. If a student arrives any time after that she will be given a late mark. A student may be late for a legitimate reason, such as an early morning appointment, in which case, please indicate this by writing a note for your daughter to explain her lateness. Please note that getting caught in rush hour traffic is not a legitimate excuse for being late to school.

The school sanctions for poor punctuality are detailed below.

Punctuality is also commented upon in your daughter's report / data collection throughout the year.

The Sanctions

- If you are late to school (without a good reason such as an appointment traffic is NOT a good reason) you will be given a ten minute detention at the end of each day of lateness with your Tutor.
- If you are late twice in a week, you will be given a half hour detention with your SPL the following week.
- If you are late three or more times in a week, you will be given an hour's detention with Ms. Pratt the following week.
- If you are late eight times, you will be placed on a two week punctuality report by Ms. King. Your punctuality will be closely monitored and your parents/ carers will be informed of any improvements. You will also be rewarded if you improve your punctuality.
- Remember being on time is a good habit to form!



Your daughters' education is very important. Regular school attendance helps pupils fulfil their potential and gives them the chance of a better future.

IT IS IMPORTANT TO NOTE THAT:

- Every day absent from school is an opportunity missed.
- Each day of absence from school means that 5 lessons have been missed.
- One week of absence means 25 lessons missed and a two week absence is over 50 lessons missed, this means your child will fall behind with her work.

You can help us to help your daughter by encouraging regular school attendance.






Overdue LRC Books

Smiling awkwardly at the new-fangled cameras, troops move towards the Front in the Great War. Their actions are far removed from the swagger and march of war films, but then this is real. Shot and screened in 1916, *The Battle of the Somme* was the first feature length documentary about the First World War to be filmed at the Front and depicts the preparation and first days of the Somme Campaign. It is estimated that over half the population of the UK watched The Battle of the Somme (a figure not matched until the release of Star Wars in 1977) making it one of the most successful British films ever made.

J. B. McDowell, who shot the film alongside Geoffrey Malins, ran The British and Colonial Film Company Studios on Hoe Street, Walthamstow from 1913-1924, one of the biggest film studios in Britain at the time. Join us for the film's homecoming screening, accompanied by an orchestra of young people from across the borough, performing a new score composed by Laura Rossi and conducted by Michael Whittaker.
