- At WSfG we will be using Start in some of our PSHE lessons to support our careers education.





What Works Best

THAMS TO W STA

- ➤ We are setting Past Exam Papers monthly, going through them and assessing them.
- Any questions that were not answered correctly need to be revised and tried again.
- ➤ We will be tracking progress using past exam papers and end of chapter tests.
- ➤ Revise the most common topics first use the blue topic list (available later in the year)
- ➤ Short bursts of revision and don't do a paper all at once (VLE.Mathswatch is great for this)

What parents can do to help

- Remind your daughter to attend maths support on Tuesdays.
- ➤ Discuss her successes, for example a good homework or result in a test.
- ➤Our LRC has some books for parents explaining how they can help their children with Maths.
- Ask your daughter to explain maths questions to you as this reinforces her learning of the topic.

GCSE English

GCSE Overview



- GCSE English comprised of two courses: English Literature and English Language
- ❖ Both courses taught side by side in Year 10 and Year 11
- Exam results for English Literature and English Language listed separately
- Speaking and Listening component a separate endorsement
- Each course requires two exams
- ❖ No coursework component

Exams Overview: Language



- All texts unseen
- Component 1: 20th Century Reading, Creative Writing
 Key Skills: Analysing language and structure, exploring effects, writing to describe or narrate
- <u>Component 2</u>: 19th and 21st Century Non-Fiction, Transactional Writing Key Skills: Analysing language and its effects, comparing ideas and methods across texts, writing to argue/persuade/advise/inform
- <u>Component 3</u>: Speaking and Listening
 Pupils present a speech and answer questions from their peers
 Assessed in lesson
 Separate endorsement

Exams Overview: Literature



- Component 1: Shakespeare, Poetry Anthology
 - 'Romeo and Juliet'
 - WJEC Eduqas Poetry Anthology
- Component 2: Post 1914 Drama, 19th Century Prose, Unseen Poetry
 - ❖ 'An Inspector Calls'
 - **❖** Jane Eyre
 - Unseen poetry practice

Developing GCSE Language Skills



- GCSE Language is often the more difficult paper.
- Pupils expected to analyse non-fiction from the 19th, 20th and 21st century, as well as make comparisons between texts.

- How to Develop GCSE Language Skills:
- Watch documentaries to improve contextual knowledge
- Read broadsheet newspapers (in print or online)
- Use online revision tools (e.g. BBC Bitesize, GCSE Pod)

Developing GCSE Literature Skills



- GCSE Literature requires in depth understanding of characters, themes and ideas.
- Pupils expected to analyse writers' methods, including contextual factors, to explore writers' meanings and messages.

- How to Develop GCSE Literature Skills:
- Revise key texts to keep content in working memory
- Revise classwork and checkpoint assessments
- Use online revision tools (e.g. BBC Bitesize, GCSE Pod)

Tracking progress



- Half termly checkpoint assessments using GCSE style questions and marked using GCSE mark scheme.
- Assessments modelled on GCSE questions, using similar language and phrasing.
- Assessments focus on key characters, themes, ideas, and extracts from key texts to support Literature exams.
- Targeted Language skills teaching for all pupils.
- Targeted intervention available after each checkpoint.
- Formal end of year mock exams.





Encourage your child to:

- watch documentaries and read broadsheet newspapers to improve language analysis skills.
- revise literature texts regularly.
- summarise key scenes, characters and themes from their literature texts to reinforce their own understanding.
- explain where she scored marks on an assessment, and what they could do to improve their work, to reinforce their understanding of GCSE style assessments.

You are welcome to call the school and speak with your child's English teacher, should you have any questions or concerns.



Science

Assessment



- AQA exam board for Science
- All students will sit six Science exams
- There are two papers for each discipline: Biology, Chemistry and Physics
- Combined Science exams are 1 hour 15 mins each
- Separate Science exams are 1 hour 45 mins each

Paper breakdown



- Biology paper 1: Units B1 to B4
- Biology paper 2: Units B5 to B8
- Chemistry paper 1: Units C1 to C5
- Chemistry paper 2: Units C6 to C10
- Physics paper 1: Units P1 to P4
- Physics paper 2 Combined: Units P5 to P7
- Physics paper 2 Separate: Units P5 to P8

Note: Separate Science students have one extra unit to cover on Space for their second separate Physics paper.

Year 10 mocks



- All students will sit paper 1 in summer 2020
- This will be one paper for each of: Biology, Chemistry and Physics
- Combined papers will be 1h 15 mins
- Separate papers will be 1h 45 mins

Advice



- Use Science overviews to inform revision and highlight areas that you need to go through
- Start learning content now, as you go along. It will help reduce a lot of stress long term
- Use GCSEPod, pausing as you go along to make key notes on specific topics
- Spend time testing yourself or having others test you on your content knowledge ensuring you have learnt material
- Practise exam questions from any exam board website, so you get used to applying knowledge, it does not just have to be AQA
- Look over AQA mark schemes to see what examiners are looking for in your answers

SIMS Parent App



- Just search for "sims parent app" in the Apple app store or Android play store and download
- You need to have a registration activation code from the school. If you need one, please contact: info@wsfg.waltham.sch.uk
