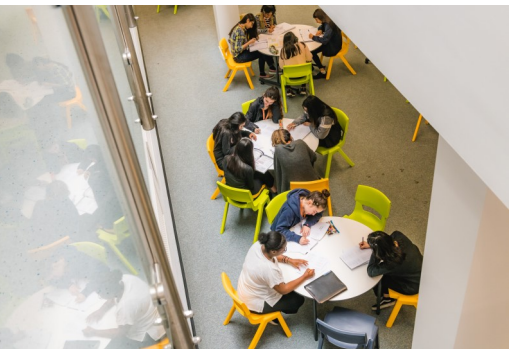
## Widening Horizons
