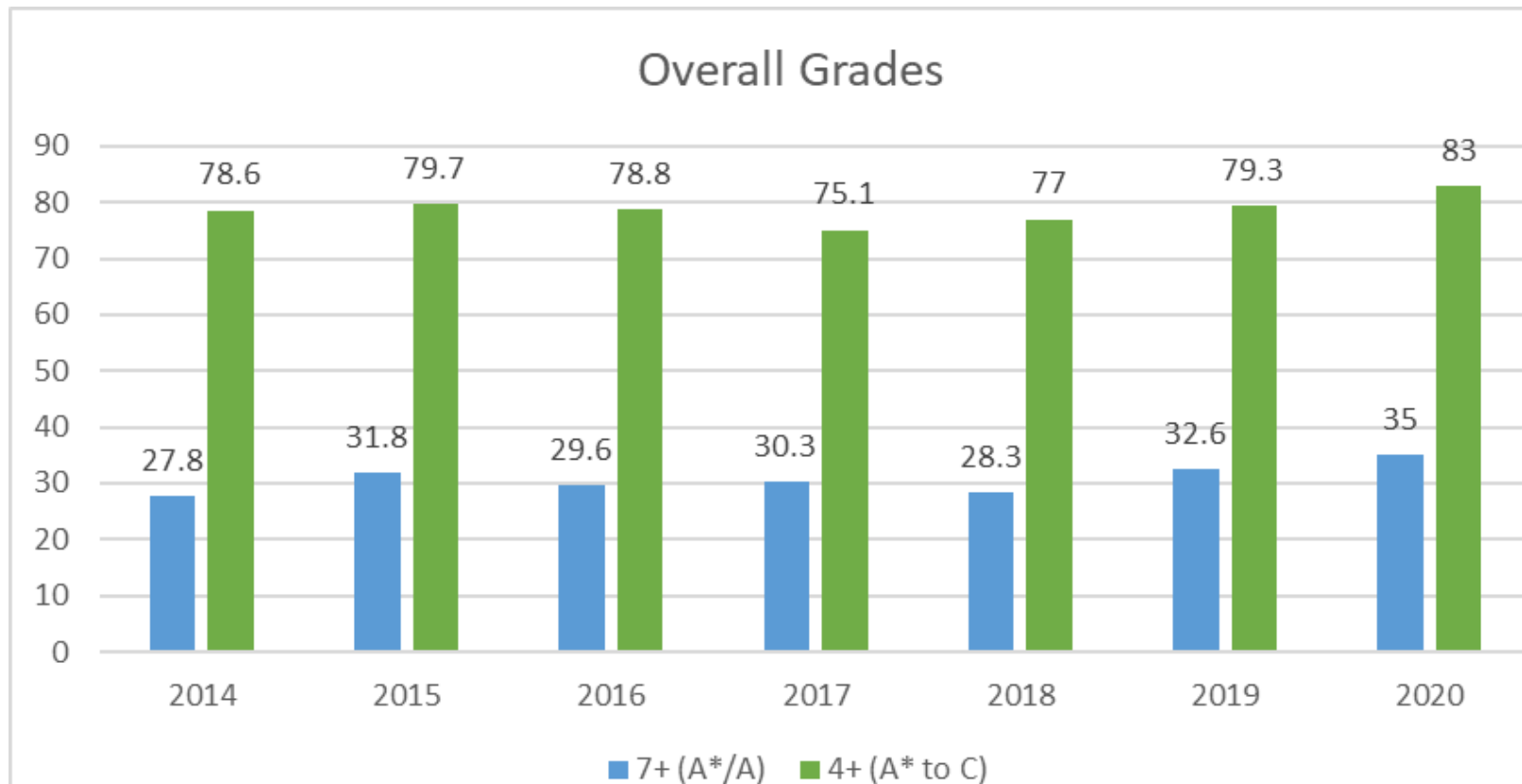

Results – Summer 2020

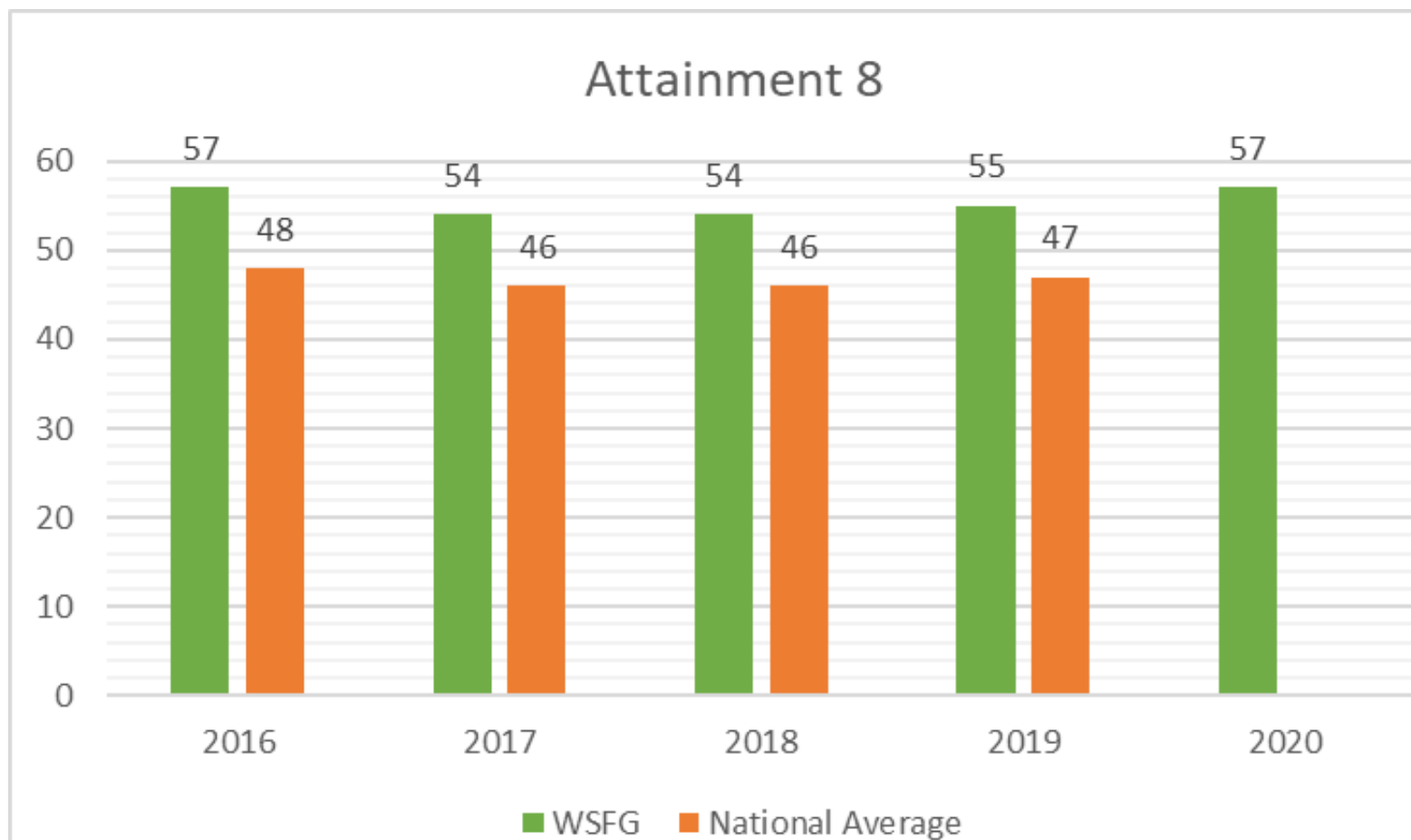
- **83%**

GCSE – WSFG Overall Grades



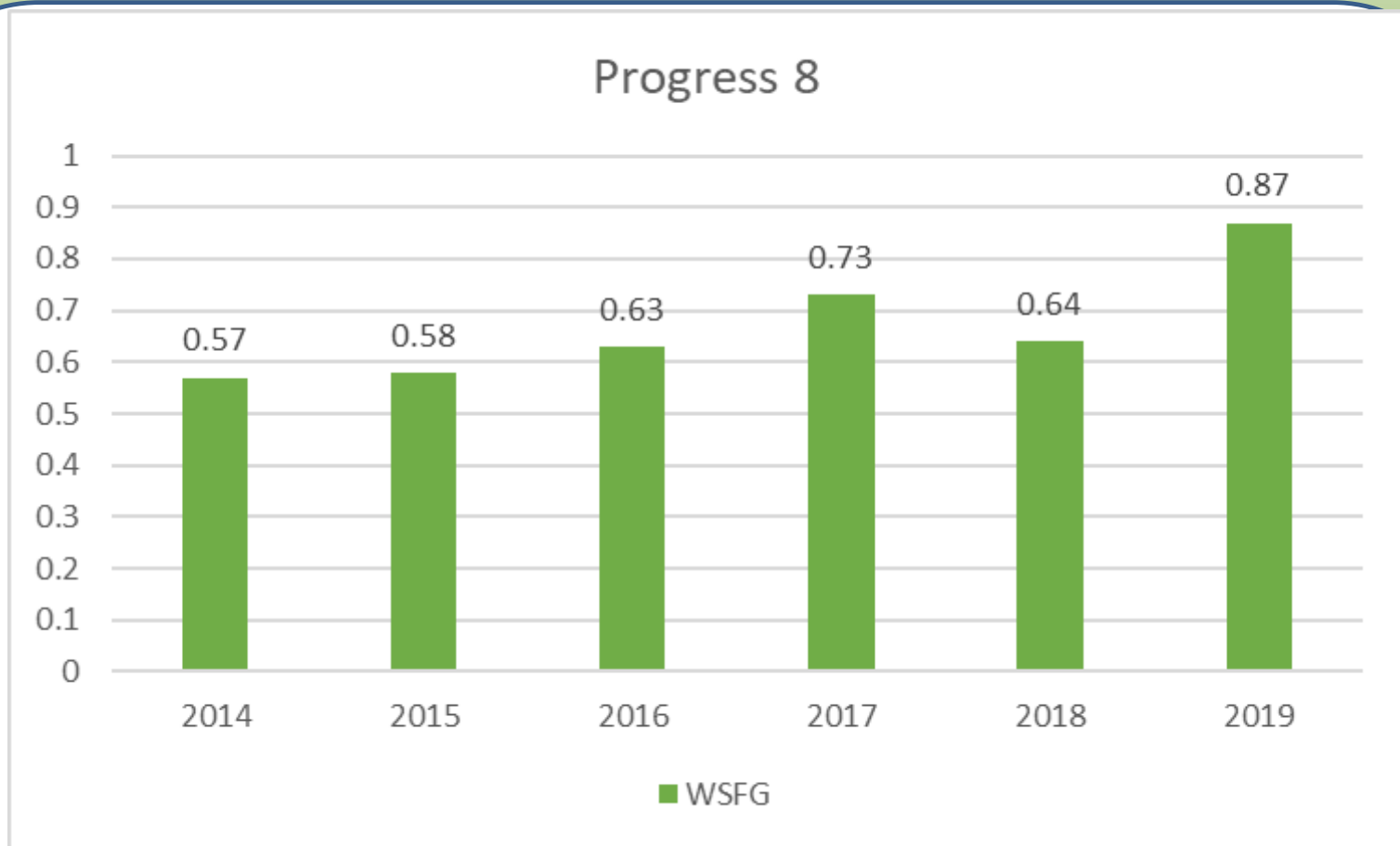
Attainment 8 – WSFG vs National Average
