The screen industries are a large part of the creative industries and cover all work in film and television. Music videos, commercials, games, visual effects (VFX), animation and digital platform content also come under the banner of the screen industries – in fact anything that you watch or interact with on a screen.

Across the world the screen industries are rapidly expanding. Britain is celebrated as a world leader in this field and the majority of work across film and television is based in London. The exceptional growth in these industries has created many recognised skills shortages and therefore great employment opportunities now and in the future.

Crew members in film and television work in many different jobs; each with their own specific skills and responsibilities working towards a common goal. They work together with discipline to bring a story to life.

We know there are many young people across London with the ability to have successful and rewarding careers in the screen industries. LSA is here to provide students from all backgrounds with the opportunity to excel in these careers, progress to higher education or to succeed in other professions. We exist to give students the opportunity to develop specific skills in the areas they find most interesting and an appreciation of the art of storytelling.

Founders

LSA is deeply rooted in the screen industries.

Working Title Films, Heyday Films, Eon Productions and Lisa Bryer are together with leading educational professionals the architects of the LSA curriculum. They have been instrumental in developing LSA as they share a strong desire to resolve the inconsistencies and skills shortages across both the film and television industries.

TIM BEVAN CBE and **ERIC FELLNER CBE** began their careers in the screen industries as runners straight from school. Since 1992, Tim and Eric have worked together as Co-Chairmen of Working Title Films, one of the world's leading film production companies that has produced *Love Actually*, the *Johnny English* films, *Darkest Hour* and *Baby Driver*. Their partnership has resulted in Working Title Films producing over 100 films that have grossed \$7.5 billion, and have won 14 Academy Awards® and 40 BAFTA awards.

Working Title works extensively with Into Film, a national organisation that aims to empower the educational and personal development of young adults through the medium of film.

LISA BRYER who began her career as a runner straight from school set up Cowboy Films in 1990. Cowboy Films produced groundbreaking music videos for bands such as The Cure, David Bowie and The Psychedelic Furs. Cowboy Films also produced commercials for clients including BMW and Kleenex and short films including the Oscar® winning *Wasp*. After producing the box office success, *The Last King of Scotland*, which won an Academy Award® and many BAFTA awards, Lisa moved from production to pursue her passion in education and mental health for young adults. Lisa has been, and continues to be, a Governor and a Trustee for a number of schools and charities.

DAVID HEYMAN began his career as a runner, locking-off sets and making copious amounts of tea on films like *A Passage To India* and *Ragtime*. He went on to work as a Creative Executive at Warner Bros. and a Vice President at United Artists, before becoming a producer in his own right.

David is perhaps best known for producing all eight *Harry Potter* films, the Academy Award® winning *Gravity*, *Once Upon a Time... in Hollywood*, *Marriage Story* and both adaptations of Michael Bond's *Paddington* books. David is currently in production on the third of J.K. Rowling's *Fantastic Beasts* films having produced the first two films in the series. Other films he has been involved with include *Juice*, *The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas*, *I Am Legend*, *We're The Millers*, *The Fault in Our Stars*, and *Maze Runner*.

MICHAEL G. WILSON OBE and his sister **BARBARA BROCCOLI OBE** co-own EON Productions Limited, the UK based production company that has produced the James Bond films since 1962. Wilson and Broccoli have produced some of the most successful Bond films ever including *Skyfall* and *Spectre*.

They have produced and executive produced independent film projects including *Film Stars Don't Die in Liverpool* and *The Rhythm Section*. Additionally, they co-produced and co-financed theatrical productions that have played in London and on Broadway including *Once*, *Othello* and *The Kid Stays In The Picture*. In 2014, Broccoli and Wilson were honoured by the Producers Guild of America with the David O. Selznick Achievement Award in Theatrical Motion Pictures.

CHARLIE KENNARD MBE is an experienced **Principal** who is passionate about giving talented young people from all backgrounds the education, opportunities and belief they need to thrive in the creative industries.

Charlie co-founded our partner school East London Arts and Music (ELAM) in 2014 and led the school as the Founding Principal.

ELAM was founded in partnership with Universal Music Group and other creative industry organisations, to support young people in the creative industries. It achieved an Outstanding Ofsted report in 2017.

Before ELAM, Charlie was a Director of Teach for Malaysia, based in Kuala Lumpur where he led its strategic development and was also 2008 Ambassador of the Teach First programme.

SAM SUMMERSON Amongst many documentary programmes as a video journalist and editor Sam worked with the BBC on *BBC Blast* which aimed to get young people into filmmaking; this is where he caught the teaching bug. Since then, he has gone on to teach film and television production across the UK in a number of large FE & HE colleges over the last 14 years, including the Global Academy in Hayes which he co-founded, set up and opened in 2016.

As **Vice Principal**, Sam has been able to work with education experts and celebrated industry professionals to design an incredibly exciting course; everything our students learn at LSA is interesting, fun, challenging and relevant to gaining a career in the creative industries.

RAFAEL ALLEYNE worked in education for nineteen years as a trained Science teacher before becoming **Assistant Principal and Director of Inclusion** at LSA. Raf's experience and areas of expertise have been in pastoral care and inclusion; he is trained in areas such as Mediation, Restorative Justice, Managing Bereavement and managing SEMH.

Extremely passionate about pastoral care and the development of young people, Raf has led students from Year 7 to Year 11, playing a strategic and supportive role in their development. He believes it is a sensational experience to see young adults achieve their goals whilst becoming good citizens.

VICTORIA BOSTOCK Having worked as a media professional for 10 years, working on a variety of high profile newspaper and magazine portfolios, Vicky chose to transfer the skills she gained in the creative industries and work in education.

Vicky has a strong history of working in progressive and vocational educational environments; previous job roles have included Acting Director of the Film, Media and Production Department at The BRIT School and Head of Media at the Global Academy where she

worked closely with the industry to deliver collaborative, real world education briefs at Post 16.

As **Assistant Principal for Film + Television**, Vicky is responsible for the large, experienced team of Film + TV teaching professionals and looks forward to training the next generation of Film + TV students.

CHLOE MCCARTHY is **Assistant Principal and Director of English + Storytelling**. She is passionate about storytelling in all its forms and supporting students throughout their two-year journey to become confident, determined and thoughtful thinkers and changemakers in society. Developing communication, language and oracy skills is a fundamental objective across the LSA curriculum and Chloe seeks to embed opportunities for this development across all areas of learning.

Prior to joining LSA Chloe worked at Mulberry School for Girls in Tower Hamlets, an Outstanding creative arts academy in East London. Chloe has long been committed to addressing social inequalities through education and has worked in a number of roles incorporating community renewal & urban policy, neighbourhood design and economic development programmes.

FIONA MCGUIRE is an industry practitioner with 26 years of experience working in Production roles within commercials, non scripted and scripted TV and feature films. Fiona has worked both as a freelancer and in full time roles for broadcasters, independent film & TV production companies, financiers and distributors.

The Industry Team, led by Fiona as **Industry Partnerships Director**, strengthens the bonds between industry and LSA to provide students with professional input and knowledge throughout their studies and to equip students with a working knowledge of the sector to maximise their employability.



LSA Curriculum

Across two years, all LSA students work towards the UAL Level 3 Extended Diploma which is equivalent to three A-Levels. The first year of LSA's curriculum provides students with a broad knowledge of the many skills and disciplines within the screen industries.

All students learn about Production and Development:



Year 12 students tailor the course to their interests by choosing one of the specialist departments:



All students must also take on one of the following AdQuals whilst at LSA:



In the second year, students have the opportunity to choose a specialism to focus on. Students will once again choose between Craft, Post-Production or Technical. Specialist study accounts for 12 hours a week of students' timetables in Year 13, with 4 hours a week spent studying Production + Development. Year 13s also continue with their AdQual.

How to Apply

We are looking for students from all areas of London to join in September 2021.



STAGE 1

Complete an online application form.



STAGE 2

Take part in an interview with a member of the LSA team.



STAGE 3

Successful applicants will be offered a conditional place to join LSA. Over the course of time from being offered a place to September, students will be invited to attend a series of events including the induction which is held in the summer.



STAGE 4

Enrolment once GCSE results arrive – this is when places are confirmed.

Students need:

- to demonstrate through the assessment process and through their school reference that they have the motivation and capacity for sustained hard work. They must also show that they have the ability, potential and interest necessary to be successful at LSA.
- a minimum of 5 GCSEs at grades 4-9, or equivalent.

LSA expects applicants to have achieved grades 4-9 in English and Maths. However, exceptions may apply where an applicant has been able to demonstrate through the assessment processes that they are capable of success at LSA.

LSA is committed to equality of opportunity and encourages applications from all London students who are genuinely passionate about the screen industries.




