

Dear Parents and Carers,

I am delighted to tell you that we are busy planning and preparing two Summer Enrichment Activity Days for all our students. This is part of our commitment to extra-curricular activities and to building cultural capital for students. We are also committed to ensuring that each student attends at least one educational visit per academic year (although many of our students experience significantly more than this).

Below, you will find a table of activities for each Year Group so that you can see what your child will be doing on each day. This is an overview of activities. Further detail for Educational Visits will be in individual trip letters.

What we need from you

Please support us and your child by:

- ensuring that you have checked and authorised any permissions and made any payments on sQuid as soon as possible (any permissions passed the deadlines given on individual trip letters will not be accepted)
- ensuring that you are aware of all the necessary information for the activities (e.g. uniform requirements, packed lunches)
- talking to your child about the activities both in advance (to set up expectations and learning intentions) and after the activities (to review any learning or outcomes)

Of course, our usual high standards of conduct and attendance are expected from all students during these days.

We always want all students to participate in activities, however, the safety and enjoyment of the whole group must take priority. Attending trips is a privilege and takes a lot of time and effort from staff. Year Group trips are also reward trips for students. There is an expectation that all students attend trips as it is an important part of our wider education. However, we will make the decision not to take any students for whom we have behavioural concerns, for example, a student who has a particularly high number of behaviour points or a student who has been involved in an incident of poor behaviour.

Please note that if a student's conduct jeopardises the safety or enjoyment of other students during a trip or activity, the lead member of staff may take the difficult decision to exclude that student from the activity and return them to school.

I'm sure your child will find these activity days both enjoyable and beneficial.
