

## Year 11 Latin Learning Journey - Term 2a

**Topics:** Latin language: Participles **Roman Civilisation:** enslaved & freed people, exam technique **Themes:** Suetonius & Virgil

### Prior learning at WSfG in KS4:

*Roman Civilisation:* The beginnings of the city, the Great fire of AD64 and subsequent rebuilding, different areas of the city and their features/buildings (Subura, Palatine, Capitoline, Ostia), life in the city of Rome, arches, aqueducts, the Cloaca Maxima, buildings & monuments including: the Pantheon, Circus Maximus, the fora (forum Romanum, forum Boarium, Trajan's forum).

*Language:* nouns in all 6 cases, verbs in 5 tenses, passive & active verbs, relative clauses, irregular verbs, use of prepositions, orders & prohibitions (noli/nolite), deponent verbs, conditional sentences. The uses of the subjunctive. Indirect Statements.

*Themes:* Artefacts & key terms.
