Attendance at WSFG

Good Attendance means being in school at least 95% of the time, aiming for 100%

Persistent absence means 10% of school is missed

Attendance less than 95% means there are huge gaps in learning

Help & Support

- Telephone calls and letters will be sent home if a student's attendance falls to persistent absentee level.
- You will be invited in to discuss what support can be given so that we can work together to improve attendance.
- We can access support within school and from the local authority where needed/required.
- Sometimes medical evidence may be requested to be shown i.e text, email, letter, prescription etc. So the absence can be authorised.

- There are 13 weeks holiday during a school year. The school will not authorise time off during term time, as this compromises learning.
- There are 190 school days each year. In order to achieve a minimum of 95% attendance, students must not be absent for more than 9 days.
- There are 175 non school days each year all this time for shopping, holidays and appointments

Absence Procedures

- At Walthamstow School for Girls, we expect our students to be in school, on time, everyday.
- Punctuality is important. Students need to be in school by 8.40am to be ready to start Form period promptly at 8.45am.
- Please inform the school before 9am each day that your daughter is absent from school and the reason why. (This can be done on school absence line, leave a voicemail if unanswered, respond to absence text)
- A text message will be sent out for all unexplained absences.
- Please arrange <u>routine appointments</u> outside of school time <u>whenever possible</u>. If unavoidable, proof of the appointment will be requested.
- Requests for absence during term time must be applied for at least 4 weeks before the event.






