HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Carers

This week has been another busy one, as usual, and chilly!

As part of our Erasmus International work, I spent a busy half term break visiting a school just outside Helsinki with Ms Cornford and Mr Caps, so we are now very acclimatised to the cold. We were examining the Finnish education system, in particular its approach to project work. Despite sub-zero temperatures our Finnish hosts were warm and welcoming and the trip enlightening. On Wednesday this week a group of 14 teachers from Italy, Croatia, Spain, Turkey and Luxembourg visited WSFG to investigate the English education system in a similar way. Such opportunities broaden our horizons and generate plenty of ideas to enhance the education of all our students. Our next planned visit is to a school in Sweden.



Earlier this week, Year 11 students completed their Food Preparation and Nutrition practical examination on Wednesday. This work is a key component of their final grade and we wish them well with this.

It was a pleasure to see familiar faces of Year 9 parents and carers at the Parents Subject Evening last night. The feedback to me was very positive.

Congratulations to *Elif, Tulin, Kamira* and *Sylvie*, who represented WSFG at the Team Maths Challenge on Thursday at Bow School.

Friday is also action packed. As well as our students wearing rainbow colours to celebrate LGBTQ+, a number of external events are planned. A group of Steel Band members will be participating in the Music for Youth regional finals in Camden and I wish them all the best of luck. You will see on Page 10 that we will be celebrating 40 years of steel pans at WSFG on the evening of 28th March. If you have previously seen these bands performing you will know why this will be a very popular event!

Also on Friday I am looking forward to accompanying over half of Year 9 students who will be visiting the British Film Institute for a day studying French culture and film.

Ultra Low Emissions Zone Consultation

I have been informed that there is a consultation in progress on a proposal to extend an ultra low emissions zone out to the North Circular Road and possibly beyond

One of the main implications of this is that anyone driving a non-compliant vehicle into the zone will be subject to a daily charge of £12.50.

All petrol cars will need to be Euro 4 (vehicles produced from from Jan 2005) compliant and diesels Euro 6 (vehicles produced from from Sept 2014).

I think it is important that everyone is aware of this and that the WSFG school community has a chance to complete the consultation survey, as it will affect us all.

Proposal to expand the ULEZ up to the North and South Circulars in 2021

The central London ULEZ scheme will come into operation in April 2019 and we are proposing that from 25 October 2021 this will cover an expanded area roughly up to but not including the North and South Circular roads as indicated on the map below.

The emissions standards for light vehicles will be:

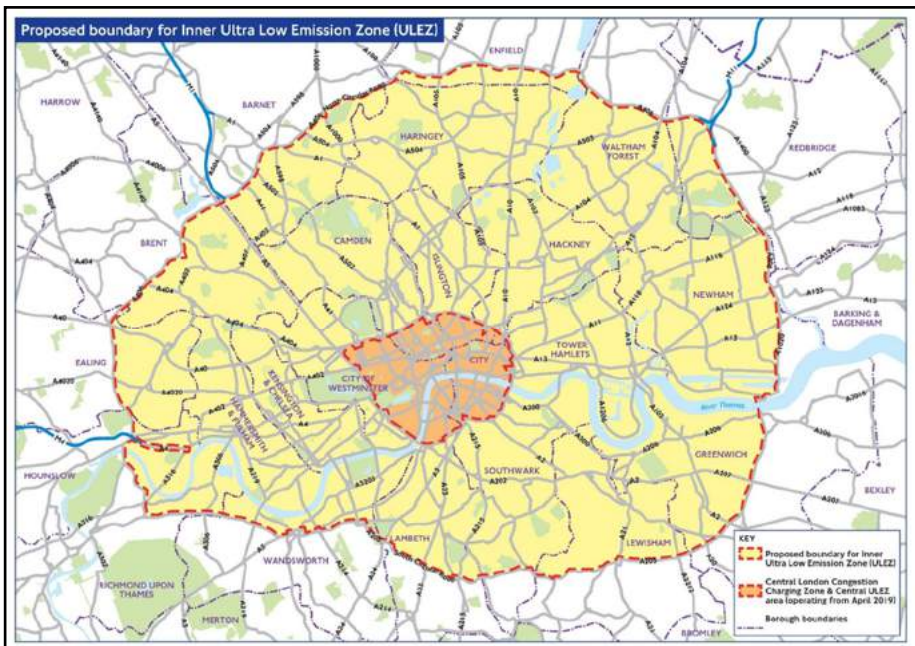
- Diesel cars, vans, minibuses and similar vehicles – Euro 6 NO_x and PM
- Petrol cars, vans and similar vehicles – Euro 4 NO_x
- Motorcycles, scooters, mopeds and similar vehicles – Euro 3 NO_x

Light vehicles which do not meet these standards would need to pay a daily charge of £12.50 in order to drive in the ULEZ. This would be in addition to any applicable daily Congestion Charge in central London.

We want your view on whether you support expanding the area where ULEZ emissions standards apply to light vehicles (cars, vans, minibuses and motorcycles).

Because of the proposed changes to LEZ, this will mean that all vehicles are subject to emissions standards in this inner London area.

We also want your view on whether **25 October 2021** is the correct date to implement the proposal.

The theme for 2018 is **#Press for Progress**

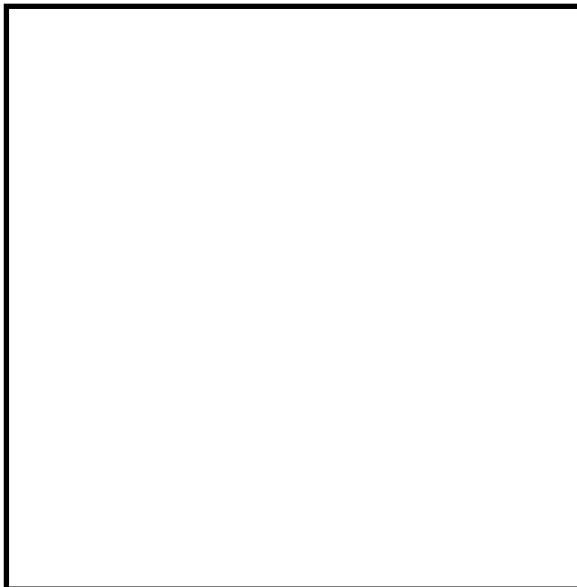
The winning design will be used on a variety of products such as bookmarks and badges.

PRIVATE COMPANIES are moving in everywhere. They are helped along by Tory government legislation, and unfortunately they also work in cahoots with even local Labour councils. They build and regenerate, so councillors can brag about providing thousands of homes.
