## Dear Parents and Carers

This week ends with Professional Interview Day on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> February for our Year 11 students. My thanks to Ms Philippou and Ms Janes for organising the opportunity for the students to apply for a mock vacancy and to convince a variety of experienced guests, involved in interviews as part of their professional role, that they would be suitable to fill the vacancy. This is excellent preparation for the future, as well as providing valuable interview practice for their college interviews.

Also on Friday afternoon Ms Desbenoit accompanied a group of students to Sir George Monoux College for an event run in conjunction with Stella Creasy MP, "Our School, our Streets, our Safety" regarding personal safety.

Sporting congratulations are due to Year 10 student *Sophie May* who won the borough under 16 individual trampolining competition on Monday to become the Waltham Forest Trampolining Champion! #### ELECTION OF PARENT GOVERNOR - February 2018

As you know I have been requesting nominations from parents who wish to serve on the Governing Body. This request has been repeated in consecutive editions of the Greensheet which you will have received by email and the information has been displayed on our website.

By the closing date on Friday 26th January I had received four nominations and as there is only one vacancy for a Parent Governor on the Governing Body it will be necessary to hold an election.

Each parent is entitled to one ballot paper, which should be returned to the school on or before Wednesday 28th February, 2018. On the ballot paper you will be able to yote for one candidate. Papers with more than the permitted number of votes will be disallowed. Ballot papers may be returned via your child, or if you wish may be placed directly in the ballot box in the school office.

The voting paper should be sealed in an unmarked envelope which should then be sealed in an outer envelope marked "Parent Governor Elections" with your name on the outer envelope. Once the name has been checked against the list of those eligible to vote, the outer envelope will be discarded and the inner envelope placed in the ballot box.

The following are copies of the statements written by the candidates saying why they wish to become parent governors; these may help you to cast your vote.

The votes will be counted on Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> March, 2018 and the outcome will be advised in the following edition of the Greensheet.
