HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Carers

Assemblies this week have focused on the Island of Dominica, where we are linked with the Goodwill Secondary School in Roseau. Some of our Year 9 students delivered an assembly on the effect of Hurricane Maria in September which devastated the island, including the school, which has been largely destroyed. The students are putting a great deal of effort into raising funds to help the school as it struggles to recover and will be holding Dominica Day to focus on fundraising events next Thursday (9th November) see page 8. This includes a visit from the link teacher in Dominica and Jane Grell, a local poet and storyteller originally from Dominica who will be reading stories and poetry in the LRC at lunchtime. Congratulations to: Kesia, Saffa, Reyhan, Brianna, Sapphire, Raum, Eva, Zalyka and Alicia in 9C and Destiny in 9H for delivering an informative assembly to the whole school.

All our Year 8 students have now visited the Old Vic to see 'The Lorax', adapted for the stage from the Dr. Seuss book. Thanks are due to Ms Cornford and other members of staff involved for making the arrangements to give the students this opportunity. We received a call from a plain clothes Police Inspector following the recent Year 9 trip to the Unicorn Theatre to compliment us on the behaviour of our students, in particular their kindness towards an elderly gentleman on the Northern Line. He said the girls had been "helpful, polite and pleasant" and was surprised to see children so "well behaved and well spoken". I commend these girls for being a credit to our green uniform. Congratulations to the students who won the Year 7 borough football competition last year and were this week presented with their winners' medals by Ms Careless-Pye (Jessica and Sylvie 8F, Molly 8G, Deja, Julia and Swain 8H, Ruby 8C and Jessica 8W). We hope the team's winning streak will continue in this year's league!

The MFL speaking mocks begin on Monday 4th December and finish on Friday 8th December 2017.



BLACK HISTORY MONTH - IDENTITY TO ME

Ella 11G performed an amazing speech in an assembly just before half term to celebrate Black History Month entitled *"Identity to Me"*. I am so proud of her, it is reproduced below:

12% of the world's population are mixed race and I am one of them. Being the daughter of a finally non-segregated society, you would think people wouldn't ask questions, but one of the most common questions I get asked is "What are you?".

People talk to me like I'm some kind of unidentified object, or that dodgy crisp you find in a crisp packet, my reply to that question should go a bit like this:


My name is Ella Palmer and I am 15 years old; my immediate heritage is Ghanaian, Caribbean, British, my mum is black and my mum is white.

But because of the unfortunate sake of common simplicity I just say I'm mixed race. Mixed race is a totally inaccurate term used to describe the 12% of the population I belong to. We all come from the same human race; therefore there simply **cannot be a mixed raced**. Instead I would rather be called mixed heritage, as it is my lineage and culture that is mixed rather than my right to be human.

Another thing I have found is that, people constantly try to apply me to a certain stereotype but I'm always either too black or too white. This just proves that no matter who you are, society is always there to try and place you in a box, with a derogative, insensitive label to go with it.

> There are more than 7 billion shades of melanin So why are there only four colours we can think in Black, white, yellow and red Four little words we can't get out of our heads I'm not a light skin, mixed race or half caste, For they are words that we should leave in the past. No matter your skin colour, religion, gender, or sexual orientation, It celebrates the contributions of an ethnic minority group, Through stories of oppression, triumph, success and hope, We live in a century of appreciated diversity Where the colour of our skin is not all we aspired to be But instead inspires and educates the people around us Recalling memories from our lifetime and of our past And I am very proud to say That looking at all of you here today, We are beautiful in every way.
