**Learning Journey** 

**Prior learning:** Students will have looked at similar themes (key figures, key moral principles, community and representation) looking at Buddhism in Year 7 and Sikhism and Hinduism in Year 8. Students will also have looked at Jewish beliefs about the creation of the world and the problem of evil, as well as Jewish food laws through the different topics in year 7. However, the wider specifics of the Judaism and its unique history will not have been covered before and prior knowledge will not be expected.
