Topic: Sibelius Arrangement task

Learning Journey

Prior learning:

**Composing** – Students learnt how to compose simple melodies and rhythms at KS3.

*Listening and Appraising –* Students have listened to a variety of genres and learnt the key features of some of these genres at KS3. They have also developed an understanding of the elements of music and how to describe these when listening.

**Performing** – Students have performed on a range of instruments at KS3. They have performed as soloists and as part of an ensemble. They have focused on timing, accuracy and expression.

Where will we use these ideas again:
