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HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Carers,

This has been a short week for the girls at WSFG.

Nevertheless, there have still been a great many activities going on. We are grateful to all of our volunteer guides and helpers who surpassed all expectations as they welcomed our many school visitors on



Thursday evening. We will also be launching our new WSFG school prospectus which will shortly be available to all via our new website.

The programme of post 16 provision visits to our school for our Year 11 students has continued; this week we hosted a well-attended visit by Forest School. Last year, one of our students took up the offer of a full scholarship there, whilst several other students made it their preferred choice.

On Thursday, thirty Year 8 students travelled to take part in the Guinness world record breaking largest Mental Health Lesson in the world-this was following a visit to the school by *Hussain Manawar*, a previous winner of the global competition who is now in training for his prize, a trip to space!

On Saturday, I am pleased to announce that we have secured places for senior students at the *Miranda Brawn Diversity Lecture* in the City of London. We are grateful to Ms Kallon, Ms Powell and Ms Yilmaz for volunteering to accompany the girls.

Also this week we have seen the launch of numerous opportunities for the girls to take part in. Below are just a selection:

- an opportunity to be a representative of the Prayer and Contemplation room, a quiet space for staff and students to pray, contemplate, meditate and read
- a trip to see the all-female cast *The Tempest* at Kings' Cross
- a chance to get involved in lots of Black History events across the school, including *Tarun Tahiliani's* fashion show inspired by the *Singh* twins and *Madhubani's* painting colouring sheets
- a nationwide poetry competition, with a prize of £1000!
- a Year 7 trip to the Royal Veterinary College

Dear Parent/Carer

Walthamstow School for Girls has a vacancy for a parent or carer to serve as a school governor and I hope you will consider putting yourself forward. The term of office is four years but you can step down earlier if you wish. The Governing Body's main tasks are to support the school, ensure that students receive high quality education and plan for future development and improvement.

If you would like to stand as a candidate please complete the reply slip attached and return it to the school no later than Friday 21st October, 2016.

If there is more than one candidate an election will need to be held but this is a straightforward process. All you need to do is write a short paragraph (no more than one hundred words) saying why you want to become a Parent Governor; this will be sent to all parents and carers with a voting paper.

Should there be only one candidate apply then this person will automatically become our Parent Governor.

The work of our governors is very important to the school in key areas such as oversight and development of the ethos and curriculum of the school; well-being of pupils; staff employment and use of resources as well as ensuring that the school maintains its high standards in all areas. You will be asked to attend an (evening) meeting of the Governing Body once (or twice) a term and invited to work on a committee of governors again once (or twice) a term. We hope you will also visit the school occasionally during the day and help in the oversight of an area of the curriculum. We are not looking for any particular expertise but rather common sense and willingness to give some of your time are the important requirements. However, if you have specialist knowledge or relevant experience, do please mention it in your statement. Training will be provided for new governors in the role.

As a school we are always mindful that the Governing Body should reflect the local community that the school serves and members of ethnic minority groups are therefore particularly welcomed on the Governing Body and are encouraged to stand for election as parent governors.

Governors will also be subject to a Criminal Records Bureau (CRB) check under the Police Act 1997, Part V and will be checked against the DFES List 99 of people who are not permitted to work with children.

Year 10: English Checkpoint Test *An Inspector Calls*


The first English checkpoint test for Year 10 will be on **Monday 17th October**.

Uniform Reminders

Dear Parents / Carers and Students,

We are very pleased with the start of term and the standard of the student uniform this academic year. The students look smart and appropriate for school. We would like to remind you of a few uniform items that are not correct.



1. Coloured non-prescription contact lenses are not allowed to be worn in school. They are being worn for decorative purposes only and are not appropriate for school.
2. Coats worn to school should be dark coloured, plain and waterproof. Ponchos and wraps are not suitable for school and must not be brought onto the school premises.
3. Winter scarves worn to school must only be black, white or green, and must be removed during lessons and when moving about the school, as they are for outdoor wear only. Scarves in any other colours or patterned must not be worn.
4. Any non-uniform items that are brought to school or worn inappropriately will be confiscated for the day and then returned to the student at 3.30pm to take home. Other incorrect items of uniform will be confiscated and the student will be asked to change into spare uniform from Student Services to ensure that she is correctly dressed for school.
5. Cardigans and knitwear of any colour other than dark bottle green must not be worn for school.

a trip to the Royal Opera House





Stella Creasy MP is co-ordinating an URGENT collection of luggage for the unaccompanied children at the Calais refugee camp, which is going to be dismantled this weekend. Most of these children have nowhere to go, and nothing in which to carry their belongings, so they are particularly vulnerable. Stella is trying to organise accommodation for them, but also needs luggage in good condition to help them move.

Rucksacks with working zips and straps- any size
Bags for life- large**

They also need working mobile phones and chargers to help the children stay in touch with charity workers, friends and family while they are on the move.


Stella Creasy and the refugee organisations will make sure that all donations are taken to Calais as soon as possible.




