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HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Carers

As you will see in this week's edition of the Greensheet, we have hosted a range of internal events for students this week, including a student leadership summit on Monday and the annual CENLIG enterprise day on Tuesday. Both Ms Warren and Ms Philippou have contributed articles about the events on the following pages, and I would like to thank both colleagues for arranging these events which excite and challenge our students.

In other news, it has also been a busy week for the school and staff as we hosted two important visits with organisations we work closely with. On Monday, the Director of the Prince's Teaching Institute, Chris Pope visited the school to discuss the schools' and staff's experience of the teacher training courses ran by the PTI via our school. As part of our role as a Teaching School Alliance, we run a range of courses for teachers from across Waltham Forest and so on Monday we had representatives from Kelmscott, Holy Family and WSFG feedback to the Director who was very impressed, both with the teachers who participated, as well as, our school as a whole. My thanks to all those who contributed and supported this visit.

On Thursday, we were visited by Tony Cann from Learning by Questions (LbQ), another organisation the school is partnered with. Whilst we are visited by representatives from LbQ semi-regularly, on this particular occasion, Andrew Jack, the Global Education Editor at the Financial Times also joined the visit to the school.



Observing Mr Walker's class, Andrew and Tony saw how we are integrating the use of technology into our classes, with Mr Walker using our newly introduced iPads to lead students using laptops through his Maths lesson. Both Tony and Andrew enjoyed observing the lesson and took the opportunity to interact with the students, all of whom represented the school positively. Thank you to Mr Walker for organising the visit and showing the strength of teaching we have at the school.

On Wednesday, we also hosted a TeachMeet event for teachers from school across Waltham Forest as part of the More Able Hub, which is a collaborative group of teachers sharing best practice to enhance teaching across our schools. Over 30 teachers attended the event to see presentations from nine speakers, including a presentation from Ms Robinson with our TedEd students. It was great to see teachers from different schools sharing their ideas and supporting each other to develop their skills to enhance the learning of the students they teach. My thanks to Ms Philippou for organising and leading the event and to our TedEd students for delivering another brilliant presentation.

Our Modern Foreign Languages (MFL) Department finished this busy week with the annual MFL festival with students dancing and singing into the weekend! I am sure parents and carers will look forward to a full write up of the event in the next Greensheet.

I hope all parents, carers, staff and students have a good weekend, and let's hope the sun returns next week.

Student Leadership Visit from Kingsmead School

Sixteen of our students from Years 7-10 were involved in the visit including school ambassadors, form reps, sports captains and LORIC leaders. Following some ice breaker activities and a GREEN lesson observation, our students gave a presentation on their leadership roles in the school and what skills they have developed. Both schools then worked together on an action plan for next year and what they want to focus on to develop student leadership even further.

The WSFG leaders involved were fantastic and our Kingsmead visitors left very impressed at the work we are doing.

CENLIG Enterprise Challenge

Students from Kelmscott School, Eden School and Walthamstow School for Girls took part in the annual inter-school Enterprise Challenge hosted by Walthamstow School for Girls. The facilitators for the day were the East London Business Association (ELBA), assisted by eight outstanding and engaging business mentors from Morgan Stanley.

The purpose of the day was to bring students together to explore and understand the important employability competencies which are critically important in today's world of work. Students were 'taken through their paces' and were a credit to their schools, as they engaged positively and creatively with the activities throughout the day. The students explored:

- Business awareness
- Aspirations, including drive and motivation
- Communication, both spoken and written
- Teamwork
- Respect for others
- Cooperation, negotiation and persuasion
- Resilience
- Problem Solving
- Leadership and Self-Management

After the initial ice breaking introductions, the students worked in groups on a range of activities, in order to embed the above skills. The first challenge was to build a usable couch out of balloons whilst carefully following a set of instructions and rules. Students were sanctioned for any breach of the rules. This added to the fun of the activity as students came to realise that any non-compliance on their part would set back the whole team. The Morgan Stanley business coaches described the process of working with the students as being



“ totally beneficial, thoroughly enjoyable and loads of fun.”

The main activity of the day saw the students engaged in planning, developing and show-casing their ideas for a social enterprise of their creation, which would be of benefit to their community. All students worked really hard on the activity and came up with many interesting and novel ideas. The growing maturity of the students was evident through the responsibility that they took, both individually and as teams, to bring their ideas to fruition. To conclude the activity, each team was required to make a presentation pitch for an investment of £300,000 for their social enterprise, as well as answer searching questions regarding finance, feasibility and sustainability of their ideas.

All the presentations were excellent, and the judges were faced with an extremely difficult task to single out a winner. The students themselves felt that the experience they had gained, together with the engagement and interaction with their business coaches was invaluable. Many of them said that, irrespective of the outcome, the day had been a win-win for all of them.

The Morgan Stanley business coaches were genuinely impressed with the contribution made by all the teams. They did however, single out two teams from Walthamstow School for Girls to go head-to-head in the final decider for overall winner. Despite the obvious disappointment from the other schools, they were gracious in their support for and appreciation of the overall winners. The students named below were outstanding in their mastery of the employment competencies. They were a real credit to the school. The judges were “blown away” by their contribution and they were deserved winners. Congratulations to:

Parent/ Carer Information

Student Leave During Term Time

A student's absence during term time can seriously disrupt the continuity of her learning. Not only does she miss the teaching provided on the days she is away, she is also less prepared for the lessons building on that after her return. There is a consequent risk of underachievement which, we and you, must seek to avoid. The school DOES NOT authorise absence during term time for family holidays or trips abroad.

Parents and carers do not have the right to take their children out of school for holidays and the school will only grant leave of absence in truly exceptional circumstances.

A student who is absent longer than ten days after an agreed return date, or without authorisation, can legally be removed from the school roll.


Parents or carers who take their daughters out of school without the authorisation of the Headteacher face court action and a fine.

In considering whether or not to authorise leave of absence, the school will look at each case individually, taking into account a student's overall attendance, her stage of education, (e.g. examinations) and the reason for the absence. It is very rare that any student is granted leave of absence.

Leave of absence forms can be obtained from the school office and all requests should be submitted to the Attendance Manager **at least four weeks before the first day of the requested absence.**

Arrangements for trips should NEVER be made before permission has been granted by the Headteacher.

Dear Parents / Carers,



I came across this snippet in the 1955 *Iris*. Mr Hazell was our Caretaker and Mrs Hazell used to run the tuck shop etc. Its nice to know that after living in the school, they were re-housed in the almshouses (they left our school in 1946).

As a sequel our prefects were invited to the opening of the soundly reconstructed section of the Alms-houses. They witnessed Col. Sir Stuart Mallinson cutting the ribbon with his own penknife, inspected the four charming new flats that combine the best of old and new, and partook of a splendid tea in the Great Hall in company with boys who represented the Monoux School. W.H.S. had given some tea and pots of flowers to greet the incoming tenants of the alms-houses to all of whom our greetings go out, especially to our old friends Mr. and Mrs. Hazell, who for so long looked after us all so well.


