#### Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents Carers and Students,

This has been a challenging week for all of us as we come to terms with the reality of another lockdown. It has also been a strange first week for me as a Headteacher, leading a school with very few staff and students in the physical building. I have enjoyed meeting the girls in our Key Worker and Vulnerable provision and I am looking forward to speaking to some of the girls in Teams meetings over the coming weeks. I have been made very welcome by staff, students and governors I have met, remotely or in person.

#### **Remote Learning**

Our staff are delivering remote lessons and students have been accessing learning via Teams. We are working hard to make sure that the learning experience is as engaging as possible and staff have been using a range of tools such as Nearpod and Kahoot. We are also using remote assemblies and tutor time to ensure that we provide the best levels of pastoral care possible.

It is really important that the girls can still engage with their teachers; we know how much students benefit from this regular contact so that they still feel part of the school community. Where you are experiencing issues, please do not hesitate to get in touch with your child's SPL.

Ms Pratt has already written to you to outline our procedures for monitoring attendance in remote lessons. Please remember that registration is at 8.45am and that all students are expected to attend every lesson in the remote school day, except for break which is from 11.10 - 11.30am and lunchtime which is from 12.30 - 1.15pm. Where students do not attend, you will receive an email about this. We understand that there may be circumstances in the home which mean that logging on or accessing devices may be difficult at certain times. We know that some of you have been frustrated where your child's attendance in a lesson has not been picked up and you have been notified about this. Please remember that we are constantly reviewing our systems to ensure that we 'get it right'. We really do appreciate your co-operation and ask you to work with us. The most important thing is that the girls continue with their education and maintain important relationships with staff through our pastoral systems.

#### **Devices and Laptops**

As you may be aware, there was a delay in the delivery of year 7 iPad before the Christmas break. These have now arrived and we are working as quickly as possible to process and issue them. Where parents have requested laptops for daughters who do not have access to a device at home, staff have worked hard to expedite the process. Distribution of year 7 iPad purchased by parents will begin on 25<sup>th</sup> January.

#### **Data Allowances**

Yesterday the DfE announced that schools can now request help to increase mobile data allowances for children and young people who:

- do not have fixed broadband at home
- cannot afford additional data for their devices
- · are experiencing disruption to their face-to-face education.

If you do not have fixed broadband and cannot afford additional data to enable your daughter to engage in remote learning, please contact the school on the info@ address. Alternatively, you could also request a 4G wireless router. We will add your name to a list and as soon as we have further information from the DfE about when the cards with additional data and routers will be available, we will let you know.

#### **Examinations: Year 11**

You will be aware that the Secretary of State made some key announcements regarding examinations this week. The first was to give schools the choice whether or not to go ahead with the BTEC examinations, even though some were due to be held the following day, and this put schools in a very difficult position. We decided not to go ahead with the iMedia and Travel and Tourism exams. We carefully considered that many girls would be disappointed not to take the exam, but this was balanced out by safety concerns, considerations of equity with GCSE examinations, as well as the effect of missed preparation and lesson time due to lockdown and self-isolation before Christmas. Thank you for your support on hearing of this decision.

The Secretary of State has also confirmed that students will not be asked to sit GCSE exams this summer. We realise that this will cause anxiety for students as they are faced with a great deal of uncertainty about exactly how they will be assessed this year. As soon as we are aware of how the system of awarding grades will take place, we will let you know.

With the cancellation of mock examinations and the uncertainty of how GCSEs will be assessed, we are making sure that we have robust data on your daughter's achievements in each of their subjects. Teachers will be setting weekly assessments, or setting elements of assignments and coursework, so that they are fully-prepared to provide an assessed grade later in the year. It is really important that your daughter takes these assessments seriously and understands that they could be used as evidence for the final grade. We also feel that in providing a wide range of opportunities, the girls will be less anxious and will have more opportunities to demonstrate their knowledge and skills.

Ms Kennedy and I will be talking to them about our plans this morning.

#### **Lateral Flow Tests**

As I write, transmission rates in London are high and 1 in 30 people have the COVID19 virus. Even though we have few staff and students in school, we are preparing to deliver lateral flow tests, with the assistance of Waltham Forest. During lockdown, this will take place with Key Worker and Vulnerable students and any staff who are working in school. This will allow us to identify anyone who is positive and asymptomatic which will help to provide a safer working environment.

I want to wish you and your daughters a safe and happy weekend.

With the announcement of a new lockdown and schools being directed to close, we want to let you know that we continue to run the following food schemes listed below in the Hilltop/Village/The Drive area. Our provision has been running since early May and we will continue to provide food for the local community for the foreseeable future.

Unlike the food banks, you do not need to prove need: all are welcome, no questions asked.

#### **FOOD STALL**

**Every Thursday 12 noon till 2pm** – free surplus food stall, including fresh fruit and veg, tinned and packaged goods, bread etc. We also sometimes have books, toys and clothes. The stall is located outside Gaitskell House by the red post box, halfway down The Drive.

We also deliver bags of food to people who are unable to collect from our food stall.

#### CHILLED MEALS

**Every Monday, Wednesday and Friday in the early evening,** cooked meals are delivered by volunteers to houses.

The meals on Mondays and Wednesdays are vegetarian and are cooked in Leytonstone by volunteers who hold a food safety qualification.

The meals on Friday meals are meat/fish or vegetarian and are cooked by the Worshipful Companies of Drapers and Fishmongers.

We currently deliver around 40 meals each day.




