Dear Jonathan,

We are very sorry that the visit you hosted for Myanmar group has dismayed one of your parents. The visit was part a World Bank funded project to support the development of a more equitable education system. UCL Institute of Education is working with the Myanmar Ministry of Education on this project. Our intention was that the delegation would benefit from experiencing the UK education system first hand and be able to apply that experience to transforming the Myanmar education system.

The international community, including the UN, UNESCO, DFID and the World Bank are funding a number of education projects in Myanmar. Some of these projects are directly related to the appalling plight of the Rohingya Muslims, whilst others are focussed on developing the country-wide education system. Whilst UCL Institute of Education recognises the appalling situation in Myanmar, it was felt that supporting the development of education may improve that situation in the long-term.
