HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Carers,

We had a celebratory start to the week as Ms Bradshaw shared the news that the acapella choir she had taken to compete at the Jack Petchey Perfect Pitch semi-finals last weekend are now through to the finals. My thanks to Ms Bradshaw for her generosity in giving her own time to ensure our students get to take part in such opportunities, and we will report on their progress nearer the time.

On Tuesday, 27 GCSE English students were taken on a trip to the British Library by Ms Simpson, Ms Durham and Ms Schaber for a talk on the Charlotte Brontë novel, Jane Eyre which they have been currently studying.

Our sporting Year 8 students had a busy evening on Tuesday. Our Year 8 football team competed with others from around the borough in the Year 8 Football League. Our team won a game, drew the next but unfortunately lost to Lammas, however the team played well together – well done to the team and to the winning team from Lammas. The Year 8 Basketball Team also had a successful evening in their borough league game, as they won 26-2. Congratulations to the team for this impressive win!

On Wednesday, the Senior Education Lead from The Schools and Teachers Network (SSAT), Alex Galvin, visited the school. Alex was given an overview of some of our current work, most of which has emanated from our longstanding relationship with SSAT in one way or another. These discussions included our work on coaching other professionals, as well as our model for student led coaching; two of our early career teachers shared their experiences of the SSAT Leadership Legacy Programme, as well as how inspired they had been at the recent SSAT National Conference in Birmingham. They were able to meet separately with over two hundred teachers who had also just embarked on teaching as their chosen profession and have been successful in gaining places on this programme. Colleagues were also able to discuss the impact of the National Professional Qualification for Middle Leaders which we are running weekly for colleagues from across the borough here. Finally, we shared our experiences of the introduction of one to one devices in lessons.

This week, the Leadership assembly was once more about the work of the Morocco based charity, Education for All. The charity raises funds to support the secondary education of girls from the Atlas Mountains by providing weekly boarding accommodation in the nearest town with a secondary school. This is necessary as the daily journey to school in winter is hazardous with roads at times impassable due to floods and snowfall. In February this year, the charity attracted the attention of the Duke and Duchess of Sussex, as you can see below. A reminder to students that on Monday 20th January, there will be a meeting at

1pm in the Norris Hall for those wanting to support the charity, through fundraising or pen friends.

I want to live in a world where everybody is equal and there is no sequel.



Election fever hits as students stage mock election by *Romayssa* Year 10, Walthamstow School For Girls



As the country went to the polls in a snap general election, students at Walthamstow Shool for Girls experienced democracy first hand by concurrently running a mock election on Thursday 12th December. However, students had to create their own political parties with policies on improving the school. This caused great excitement and on 29th November, registration forms were sent out to apply for candidacy. In order to apply, you had to state your party's policies and attend a meeting the following day.

After careful consideration, the parties selected were Getaway Friday followed by Cool Kids, Political Stars, The Diversity Party, TRISN, The L.I.F.E Party, Walthamstow's Diverse Democracy (WDD), The Situation and Your Voice.

The policies each party pitched varied, from environmental concerns to student welfare and mental health. The Walthamstow Diverse Democracy even considered how they would tackle wide-world issues. However, Getaway Friday won by a landslide due to their particularly appealing policy on reducing school hours on Friday.

The following week, hustings took place daily at different year group assemblies in which they had only 2 minutes to present and promote their party. Campaigning also took place in other forms such as posters -which plastered school walls- and flyers all in a frantic attempt to be heard. However, each party had a limited budget of 25 A4 pages in order to enforce our "Green Vision".

Fatimah 12, a candidate of The L.I.F.E Party said: "Although we didn't win, this was a great experience and was a great challenge that has helped me become more politically aware."

Wendy 14, a candidate of Your voice said: "It was much harder than I thought and has definitely been unpredictable, much like the real elections, but it still was a great learning experience."

Mock Elections actively engage pupils with the democratic process and help raise awareness of how politics affects our everyday lives. It has provided pupils with the opportunity to gain an insight into the election process; from creating manifestos to designing campaign posters. Meanwhile, students not participating also gained experience as they helped organise the election itself by registering voters, preparing the polling station and counting the ballot papers. Overall the turnout and feedback was incredible and could even be described as reaching "election fever". It also allowed students to voice their opinions on improving our school.
