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#### Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents, Carers and Students,

This week has been the culmination of a busy couple of weeks for our faculties as they have been tasked with producing virtual tours of our school and the departments as we are unable to host our usual Open Evening this year. As I have said previously, it is not just our students adjusting to new ways of working, it is indeed our entire school. We also had some help from some Year 8 and Year 11 students at the beginning of the week as they took part in Q&A sessions and recorded speeches, all giving insight to their experiences at the school. I would like to thank all those students who have supported the school and staff who have created some fantastic content for prospective parents/carers and students. We are all looking forward to sharing our Virtual Open Evening on Thursday 15th October.

I would like to bring parents/carers attention to parking outside of the school, frequently on the double yellow lines, when dropping off and collecting your child. We have had numerous complaints raised by residents, not only due to the danger of the manoeuvres cars must make on Church Hill Road, or the illegal stopping, but also because of concerns about the air pollution of the area

caused by cars waiting with their engines idling. We would be grateful if the parents/carers in our school community, could support the school and your child by encouraging them to walk, scoot, cycle or use the assigned school buses. If you have to drop off or collect your child, we would ask that you do so away from the school, with the exception of those students who have to be dropped off/ collected near to the school because of health conditions.

Once again, we have had some wet weather, albeit not as sustained as it was last Friday. Please ensure that your child comes to school well prepared with an umbrella and waterproof coat. Due to the controls we are obliged to have in place to minimize the risk of spreading the virus, our students must line up outside in year groups, before lunch, ready for handwashing prior to entry to the Dining Hall. On wet lunch and break, students are permitted to return to their base room for that day. As we have no alternative indoor option given the requirement to handwash and retain their year group 'bubbles', it is important that parents and carers ensure that their child is prepared for the elements as winter approaches. Students with health conditions are, of course, accommodated indoors. Some year groups – and staff, including myself, were unfortunately caught out in a heavy yet relatively brief rainstorm on Thursday. In normal circumstances, we are able to plan ahead and retain the students in their classrooms after lunch on wet days.

I wish our entire school community a safe and happy weekend.

We are hosting our first face-to-face Open Day of the academic year this Saturday 10 October, from 10am to 3pm, across all six of our campuses in London.


