Dear Parent/Carer

You will be aware that we have been undertaking a consultation process with regard to SEND funding, through our use of the High Needs Block (HNB) funding that we receive from the Government. This consultation ended on the 10 July 2019. I would like to take this opportunity to thank those of you that have responded, either through one of the consultation meetings, through the online survey, or by contacting us directly to provide feedback. All of your responses are being collated and carefully considered, and will inform the next stages of the process, along with any final decision.

The Council very much recognises that this remains a sensitive, complex and challenging issue, and one which many Local Authorities are facing. <u>The Council has decided to delay taking a decision on the current proposals</u> so that further engagement can take place with key stakeholders and to allow for further dialogue with the Government regarding the funding arrangements for SEND.

Having considered the responses to the consultation received so far including feedback from our public meetings, we have decided to create a SEND Stakeholder Engagement Group. The group will discuss the funding arrangements, consider feedback from the consultation and provide feedback and ideas to further develop proposals. The intention is that members of this Group will attend three 'SEND workshops', which will be held in late July and early September (proposed dates are Wednesday 24 July 10:00-11:00am, Tuesday 3 September 3:00-5:00pm and Thursday 12 September 2:00-4:00pm).

The Group will include representatives from the LA, the SEND Parent Forum, Schools and also individual Parent/Carers who are not part of the Parent Forum. We want five representatives who are parents/carers of children with SEN to take part in this process. We will invite five representatives of Schools and two representatives from the SEND Parent Forum. If you would like to be one of the parents/carers who takes part please see below.

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Following the workshops, a report will be taken to Schools Forum in October. It is anticipated that any Council decision regarding the proposals will take place later that month.

Should any Parent/Carer wish to volunteer to be part of the SEND Stakeholder Engagement Group, they should send their request to Natasha Clayton at <u>Natasha.clayton@walthamforest.gov.uk</u> by Friday 19 July at 12pm.

All applicants must be prepared to attend the workshops on the dates that are being proposed. Selection of those who will be invited to take part (in the event that more than five applications are received) will be based on the needs of the group to cover the broadest range of ages and needs of our cohort of SEND young people.

Once again can I thank you for all of your engagement and responses that we have received to date. I look forward to continuing to work with you to find the best solutions for our young people and families.

Girls Rock London (GRL!)

Who we are

Girls Rock London (GRL!) is a music project for girls and women in London. We are part of a movement of rock camps that take place all over the world, united by a desire to achieve gender equality in the music industry and to ensure that all girls and women get the chance

to make music. The aims of the project are to empower girls and women – regardless of previous musical experience – to write and perform music, and to build self-confidence.

The programme we run is a mixture of musical/technical tuition and workshops, which together help to build participants' self-esteem and confidence, and provide a platform for girls and women to find and develop their voices. Rock Camp is all about trying new things, working together and making lots of NOISE

Registration for Girls Rock London 2019 is now open!! GRL! welcomes applicants who self-identify as girls, women, trans* and/or gender non-conforming. Open to girls, young women, trans and gender nonconforming youth aged 11-16.

Our Summer Rock Camp is a week-long programme featuring instrument instruction, workshops, visiting artists, band practice and a showcase performance. Campers have instrument tuition every day in groups of five, and at the end of the week perform an original song they have written with their bands, and the support of coaches and mentors, in front of friends and family.

The programme is designed to improve participants' confidence and selfesteem, and our 1:1 volunteer/participant ratio means that we provide tailored musical and pastoral support to participants. All sessions are led by our amazing team of volunteers – women, trans and gender nonconforming folks with experience in the music industry, education and youth work.

This year's camp will be held at Berger Primary School in Hackney from Monday, July 29th to Saturday August 3rd inclusive.
