Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents Carers and Students,

Our Year 11 students took part in careers activities this week, which was a welcome and beneficial experience for the group. Students heard remotely from a number of industry professionals who work across a range of sectors and were able to ask questions. Meanwhile, a group of Year 11 students had one-to-one remote careers meetings with an adviser. They were given individual advice to help plan for their future career. Normally, we host these meetings onsite; however, with that not being possible this year, it is another good test to see how we can effectively adapt our practice. It is also so important that our students still have access to crucial opportunities such as these and obtain advice to help them prepare for the next stages, whether that is an apprenticeship, employment or a post-16 education institution. I would like to thank Ms Warren for arranging the activities.

You will see in this week's Greensheet that we have some fantastic news in relation to two of our students who are competition winners, and both happen to be in Year 8 (see pages 7&8). *Shakira*, 8H, entered the Design Ventura 2020 Mini Challenge, after Ms Healy publicised it to students in the Greensheet with her interesting design, *Shape Sky Light*. Congratulations to *Shakira*! *Husna*, 8F, submitted her review of the book 'Famous Five Go Adventuring Again' by Enid Blyton to the Student Star Reviewer, along with some colourful illustrations, and was featured on the Accelerated Reader's Twitter page. Congratulations also to *Husna*!

In school, we have launched our own annual competition to design the school Christmas card. 






STEM Competition Design Ventura Mini Challenge Year 7 and Year 8
