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HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Carers,

We have returned to our last half term before the Christmas holidays and the sudden drop in temperatures has certainly reminded us all of that.

On Monday, we continued our Black History Month celebrations with another Drama and Diversity collaboration trip to see the performance 'A Scandal in Bohemia'. The production featured an all-female cast from a range of backgrounds, with the play being based on the first Sherlock Holmes story. Whilst it was first published in 1891, the performance was a modern take, tackling issues of fake news and feminism. Reviews from our students will follow in the next edition of the Greensheet. My thanks to Ms Desbenoit, Ms Cornford, Mr Ramlagan and Ms Simpson for supporting students on this trip.

On Tuesday, myself and Ms Cornford took a group of Year 10 students to Lammas School to see the touring production of 'The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time'. Based on Mark Haddon's best selling novel, the play has won many prestigious awards and it was evident why with our students engrossed in the performance, which myself and Ms Cornford also enjoyed.

On Wednesday, our GREEN trips for Year 7 students began, continuing through until Friday. Students were taken to the 'Extreme Play Area' for the afternoon at the Waltham Forest Feel Good Centre. Our students had a lot of fun bouncing in the trampolining room and making their way through the obstacle course. It was also a great opportunity for our new students to bond with their fellow form groups and make new friends. My thanks to Mr Morrow and Ms Farmiglietti for organising and supporting students on this trip.

On Thursday, 15 Year 9 students took part in a masterclass at the Donmar Warehouse, continuing their collaboration with the group as part of their 'Take the Stage' project. Students further developed their skills for the upcoming performance with professionals based at the theatre. Afterschool on Thursday, a range of teachers from schools across the borough visited WSfG to begin their NPQML course (National Professional Qualification for Middle Leaders), which has been facilitated via our Teaching School. This course has been developed to enhance the skills, knowledge and behaviours of Middle Leaders in schools to enable them to progress to senior roles and to also make Middle Leaders more effective in the current roles by looking at the latest research in education and leadership.

On Friday, we closed the week with another course being run by our Teaching School, the TSST (teacher subject specialism training) which we are running to support teachers across the borough to develop and refresh their knowledge in their subject area and enhance their confidence to teach subjects. Developmental opportunities such as these are important in ensuring our students receive the best education from their teachers.

Finally, I would like to wish a Happy Halloween to all our students who celebrated on Thursday and I hope our entire school community enjoy the fireworks displays taking place around the local area and city this weekend!

Focus of the Fortnight 4th – 15th November Student use of toilets during lessons.

Dear Parents / Carers,

All student toilets are open for use before school, break, lunchtime and after school. During lessons there will be two sets of toilets open for student use in the centre of the school. The remainder of the students toilets will not be in use during lessons.

The expectation is that students do not leave a lesson to go to the toilet unless in an emergency. In such cases the member of staff will sign the student planner to give permission for the student to use the nearest open set of toilets. Students will not be allowed out of lessons to fill water bottles etc. as they need to do this at break or lunchtime. If a student is found to be using an access toilet without permission, a leadership detention of 1 hour will be applied.

Lessons are for learning and we wish to minimise the disruption to this for all students.



The sessions run from 9.30am to 11.30am and are free to attend. Participants will be inspired by the breadth of Frankin's scientific curiosity and carry out experiments




to further their understanding of a range of core topics from the Key Stage 3 science curriculum. Please find further details of upcoming sessions below:
