Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents, Carers and Students,



Yesterday, I looked out of my window to see that yellow crocuses have started to appear on the lawn outside and, rather wonderfully, children were walking through the gates! Our year 11s had started to return, if only a few at a time, socially distanced and at regular time intervals for their book collection. Still, it has been lovely to see

them, to introduce myself and to talk to them about their learning and plans for next year.

We are also really looking forward to welcoming KS3 students for book collections next week. Hopefully, we will see all of the girls back in school, as soon as we are able and it is safe to do so. We are missing seeing you all.

In the meantime, our planned Wellbeing days for KS3 should help students to take time away from the screen, enable them to undertake reflective and creative tasks, as well as providing an opportunity to collect any resources they need. Students in our KW provision will have in-school activities arranged on those days. There are further details below.

Body, Mind and Spirit: LGBT+ History Month

The month of February is traditionally LGBT+ History Month and at WSFG we will be celebrating in lessons across the curriculum. This year's theme of 'Body, Mind and Spirit' seems particularly apt as we reflect on our own wellbeing and ways in which we can look after ourselves and encourage others during lockdown. It is a perfect opportunity to contemplate our own circumstances, to empathise with others or to become activists and allies on their behalf.

We are encouraging students to take part in a competition, either to design a logo for this year's theme or for next year's theme which is 'Art and Politics 2022', linked to the words of Martin Luther King "The arc is long, but it bends towards justice." Students will submit their designs as assignments in their PSHE classes, with a deadline of Friday 26th February.

Year 7,8 and 9 Book Collection

Dear Students, Parents and Carers,

We are very aware that Year 7, 8 and 9 students are not in possession of all the books and resources they may need for their subjects. Clearly, we do not want this to hamper their remote learning therefore we will be holding a book collection foreach year group as stated below.

All students will be given a specific time slot to collect their books and resources and it is very important they only come to school at that time.

Year 7 - Tuesday 9th February

Year 8 - Wednesday 10th February

Year 9 - Friday 12th February

This will be a wellbeing day where all students' complete activities that give them a break from their screens for the day and allow them to work independently on creative, imaginative and fun tasks. No subject lessons will take place on this day. We are going to have a theme for each day so the students are clear on why they are doing the activities:

Year 7 Thoughtful Tuesday.

Year 8 Well-being Wednesday.

Year 9 Feel-good Friday.

Given Covid restrictions, this will be the ONLY opportunity for your child to collect books and resources therefore we strongly encourage them to do so.

The following Covid Rules will apply and MUST be followed to ensure we keep everyone safe and comply with current Government guidelines.

- The book collection will take place outdoors beside the MUGA and no students will enter the building. Students should report to the entry gate they used last term at their allocated time.
- There will be strict 2m social distancing in place with markers on the ground indicating where to stand.
- Masks must be worn as books are collected.
- Hand sanitiser will be provided and must be used before books and resources can be collected. We recommend gloves are worn when collecting books and resources.
- Only one person can enter the main school gate to collect the books or resources, either your child or you as their parent/carer. If you wish to escort your child to school that is fine but we kindly ask that you wait outside the school gate.




