Examinations Fortnight: 13th-24th May 2019

All students in Year 7, 8 and 9 will be sitting summer examinations in the following subject areas:

- English
- Mathematics
- Science
- Humanities
- Modern Foreign Language

This booklet outlines the length and focus of each examination so that you know what to expect in each subject and so that you can prepare yourself.

- ◇ Examinations will be held in normal lesson time when you are timetabled for the subject and will be in your normal classroom. The week before the examination fortnight, your class teacher will be able to tell you which lesson the examination will be held in.
- ◇ It is important that before an examination you line up in silence outside the classroom and enter in silence when instructed by the teacher.
- ◇ You will be allowed to take a pencil case to your desk but all bags and coats must be left at the front of the classroom (your teacher will give you instructions).

I. English

Number of examinations: 2

Length of each examination: 45 minutes

Name of examinations:

- ◇ English
- ◇ English Literature

This examination will assess students' knowledge and understanding of:

- ◇ Paper 1 – English: Creative Writing
- ◇ Paper 2 – Literature: Much Ado About Nothing

Students should prepare for this by:

- ◇ Writing imaginative and engaging short stories; including interesting characters, effective dialogue and thoughtful plotline.
- ◇ Revising key characters and themes in Shakespeare play studied.
Analysing language and effect.

2. Mathematics

Number of examinations: 1

Length of examination: 1 hour

This examination will assess students' knowledge and understanding of:

Everything that is on the skills and knowledge map for the class that you are in.

Your skills and knowledge map can be found in your exercise book but you can get a spare copy from the Maths faculty office.

Students should prepare for this by:

Revising using the internet:

Going over class-work using your textbook.

3. Science

Number of examinations: 1	
Length of each examination: 1 hour	
This examination will assess students' science skills :	
◇ Data analysis	
This examination will assess students' knowledge and understanding of:	
Biology	Microorganisms Digestive system Balanced diet Respiration Photosynthesis
Chemistry	Word equations Separation techniques
Physics	States of matter Temperature SI units
Students should prepare for this by:	
◇ Recording/revising using Exploring Science text book	
◇ Practice questions in text book	
◇ Use exercise book to revise	

4. Humanities

Number of examinations: 1

Length of examination: 50 minutes

Format

Section A: Geography (15 marks),
Section B: History (15 marks)
Section C: Religious Studies (15 marks)

Each section will have a combination of short answer knowledge based questions and extended questions, ending with an essay linked to the topic. Students will need to answer all questions

Timing

50 minutes (15 minutes per section plus 5 minutes reading and checking time)

This examination will assess students' understanding of:

Geography: *Population, resources and environmental issues (15 marks):*

- ◇ General geographical skills e.g. compass points, grid references, distance and scale;
- ◇ Reasons for population growth (both natural increase and migration)
- ◇ The problems with resourcing a growing population;
- ◇ Managing population growth (including population policies);
- ◇ Environmental issues created by our growing population (e.g. global warming, deforestation, overfishing).

History: *Making of the UK (15 marks):*

- ◇ The reasons for Henry VIII's break from Rome in 1534;
- ◇ The slave triangle and the middle passage;
- ◇ Life on plantations;
- ◇ The abolition of slavery.

Religious studies: Sikhism (15 marks):

- ◇ The importance of Guru Gobind Singh
- ◇ What the K's are and what they represent
- ◇ You will need to be able to explain at least one major Sikh festival;
- ◇ Sikhism, media representation and human rights.

Students should prepare for this by:

- ◇ Reading through the notes in your different Humanities books;
- ◇ Looking back over your previous assessments;
- ◇ Looking at relevant resources on BBC Bitesize;
- ◇ Creating your own revision materials e.g. flash cards, mind maps, revision notes etc.

5. Modern Foreign Languages: French, Spanish or Urdu

Number of examinations: 1

Length of examination: 1 hour

This examination will assess students' knowledge and understanding of:

- ◇ My family/personal details
- ◇ My house and local area
- ◇ Freetime/Hobbies and interests
- ◇ Daily routine
- ◇ Grammar tenses including present past and future.

The examination will cover listening, reading and translation skills.

Students should prepare for this by:

- revising from their exercise book
